

UPA Refinery Environmental Subcommittee
Monthly Meeting – July 12, 2016
Tesoro Refinery

Summary

Members were reminded of the UPA Anti-Trust Guidelines, which basically prohibit discussions related to current or future prices, production levels, costs of production, markets, boycotts of products or services, or any other unfair practices.

The next meeting is scheduled for August 9 at 11:30 a.m. at the Chevron Refinery. Nobody from Chevron was at the meeting, so Mike will attempt to confirm with John.

There was not much activity or much to report since the last meeting. There was no State Air Quality Board meeting this month.

There has been no official response to the State from EPA on the PM₁₀ SIP. It was noted that there had been earlier comments that the Title V Permits would be further delayed if there had been no response by June, so it is very unclear how the State will be proceeding on the Title V permits. There was no reported action on the applications that were submitted by the other refineries on June 20th.

The reports that were posted by the State on toxics monitoring in the areas of Beck Street and Davis County were discussed. The two newspaper articles did not contain a lot of information, but also did not say anything that would be considered bad. There had been no public responses, but the articles had just been published that morning.

It was noted that there is a potential Notice of Compliance deadline for tanks coming up on September 29th.
